

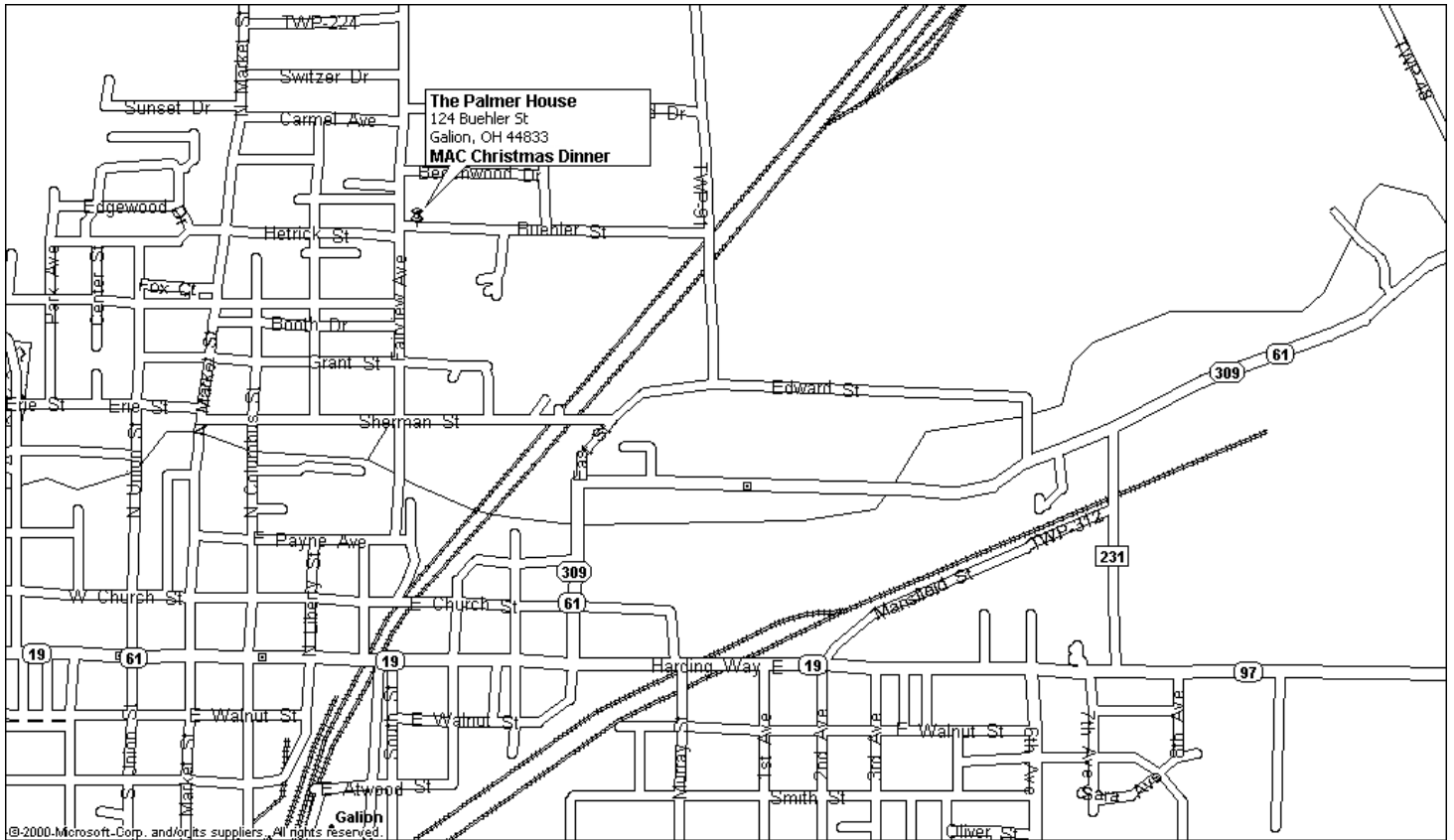

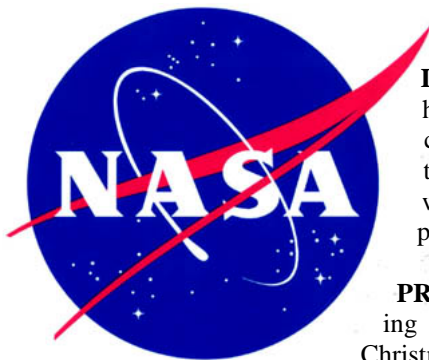

RENE FERNANDEZ, a research engineer in the Turbomachinery & Propulsion Systems Division, joined the staff of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's John H. Glenn Research Center in June 1987.

As an engineer, he has conducted research on hypersonic inlets, subsonic nacelles, advanced aircraft inlets, and optics. He has also written and presented papers on high-speed inlets and surface light scatter at several conferences. He is a Senior Member of the American Institute of Aeronautics & Astronautics and has served in leadership positions for various committees of the AIAA and various other technical societies.

He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering, Fluid and Thermal Sciences from Case Western Reserve University in 1986 and a Master of Science degree in Engineering from Case Western Reserve University in 1993. In 1994, Mr. Fernandez earned his FAA Pilot Certificate. He is a licensed Professional Engineer in the state of Ohio and is currently working on his Ph.D. at Case Western Reserve University.

He is listed in *Who's Who in the Midwest*, *Who's Who in Science and Engineering* and *Who's Who in America*.

In his spare time, he enjoys flying search and rescue missions for the Civil Air Patrol, and enjoys scuba diving, skiing, dancing, karate, and astronomy.

Reservations must reach our post office box by Monday November 28th in order for us to send the total attendance to the Palmer House.

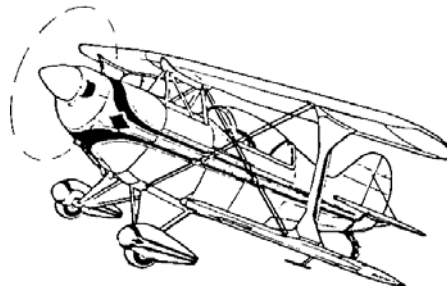
