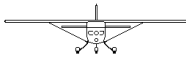

## Regular Meeting

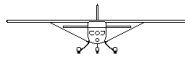

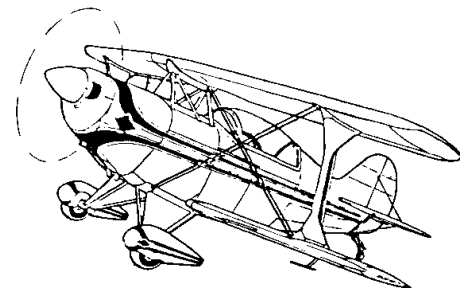
## Fall Young Eagles

## Christmas Party with AOPA Prez Phil Boyer

Tickets for the MAC Christmas Party are available now. Although we are paying a bit more for the meals this year, our member price will stay the same as the last two years - \$16.00.

We are required to pay full price for "no show" reservations. Unfortunately we have to pass that liability along to members and guests. For that reason, this is a reservation only event. Reservations are entered only when accompanied by payment in full. If your plans change unexpectedly, we will make every effort to put someone else in your place and refund your money. Just let us know in time to resell your seats.

Please consider sending along your 2001 MAC dues with your reservations for the Christmas Party. The amount of work our volunteer officers have to do is cut in half if you can do this with your dinner reservations. Two diners and 2001 dues come to a total of \$44.00. For any other combination the dinners are \$16.00 and dues are \$12.00. Please get your reservations in early. MAC members have exclusive access to early purchase tickets before they are available to other aviation groups or the general public.

Ticket distribution will work exactly as it did last year. Tickets will be filed by last name and available for you to pick up at the "will call" desk the night of the party. If you would prefer to keep the tickets yourself, a stamped self-addressed envelope included with your payment will get your tickets in the mail as soon as they arrive from "Otcasek Printing." Here is a little information about our guest speaker;

### Phil Boyer



Phil Boyer became only the third full-time president in the 60-year history of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association on January 1, 1991.

A long-time broadcasting executive and general aviation advocate, Boyer is a 6,000-hour instrument and multi-engine-rated pilot who has been flying for more than 33 years, 15 of those as an aircraft owner.

Boyer was previously Senior Vice President-Development for Capital Cities/ABC Video Enterprises Inc. There, he explored new business opportunities in communications technologies and coordinated ABC's international business activities. Boyer also created ABC's "Wide World of Flying" quarterly subscription-based video magazine.

Among several top executive posts at ABC, he held vice president and general manager positions at flagship ABC television stations WABC-TV in New York and WLS-TV in Chicago. Boyer's broadcasting career began at his Portland, Oregon home, where a small basement radio station eventually became the campus radio station of Lewis and Clark College.

Boyer earned a degree in communications from Sacramento State University, stayed on there as an associate professor of communications,

and later became program director and station manager for KCRA-TV in Sacramento.

The recipient of numerous broadcasting awards, Boyer has served as president of a major broadcasters association. In aviation, he was chapter president of the American Bonanza Society and president of the Sacramento Valley Pilots Association. He has been honored by the Federal Aviation Administration for his "save" of a fellow pilot in distress and has flown the Atlantic twice in a general aviation aircraft.

On February 13, 1992, Boyer was elected president of the International Council of Aircraft Owner and Pilot Associations, which represents 53 national AOPA organizations and 400,000+ pilots the world.

With his unique background in aviation, communications, associations and business management, Phil Boyer is uniquely qualified to lead the 360,000-member AOPA into the next century in service to America's 640,000 pilots and aircraft owners.
